Matteo Garbelotto of the UC Berkeley Forest Pathology Lab will present results of this year's survey of sudden oak death infection in Sonoma County and around the Bay Area at a public meeting Friday night in Santa Rosa.

The meeting will be from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the UC Cooperative Extension Office, 133 Aviation Blvd., Suite 109.

Garbelotto and colleague Doug Schmidt will advise property owners on how to protect their trees from the sudden oak death pathogen in two meetings, also free and open to the public, on Saturday.

The first meeting is from 10 a.m. to noon at the Sebastopol Veterans Building, 282 High St., Sebastopol, followed by a session from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday at Spring Lake Park, Upper Oak Knolls Picnic Area, 5585 Newanga Ave., Santa Rosa.
